"I don't get a lot of time for myself being a single parent and I need the respite to help my own autistic sense of space. It's reasonably priced and accessible."

Spring School Holiday Program

The Spring School Holiday Program is all wrapped up and wow – it was a big one! We welcomed 24 children with their parents and guardians for sessions including Pizza Making and Art and Craft. Everyone had a go at creating their own pizza dough from scratch – we might have some future chefs in our midst! Our pizzas were creative and delicious, with a few cheesy crust and heart-shaped pizza experiments, and this session provided the children opportunities for adventurousness and encouragement in the kitchen.

We made kites in our Art and Craft session, first watercolour painting our fish kites before stringing them up and making a school of fish! Then the fan-favourite Magiclay came out and we sculpted our 3D scenes, some of remote islands and volcanos, others of geometric patterns. The kids were able to take home Magiclay packs to enjoy back at home too. Meanwhile, local artist Michael Leeworthy was on site to create a gorgeous underwater mural to be donated to the Saltbush site, and we all loved watching this piece come to life!

As always, we love to provide our families opportunities to enjoy some local attractions they may not otherwise be able to access. Families went off to the Moonlit Sanctuary, Arthur's Seat Eagle, and Enchanted Adventures for a day of fun as family. These programs are only possible with the support of our incredible volunteers, and the enthusiastic involvement of our wonderful Saltbush families. Thank you to volunteers Rex, Jacqi, Audrey, Lyn, and Rose and our Saltbush families for joining us this week! We are already looking forward to our Summer Program!









Saltbush Working Bee

Saltbush kicked off spring with our annual Working Bee, a wonderful day of painting and gardening. Luckily, the rain held off for just long enough! We had 21 volunteers join us to paint the bedroom cupboards and living room dado walls in House 1 and 2, and for weeding, mulching and planting in House 1 and 2's gardens, as well as our office area and new entry. CEO & CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

We know that an increasing number of children are suffering because of poor mental health and access to care can be slow, difficult, and expensive. Many families are struggling to provide the support needed. Saltbush has been receiving an increase in referrals from services that support these families. We can offer a circuit breaker for families - a welcoming, large space for some down time together in a peaceful environment; inclusion in school holiday programs with fun and mindful activities such as art, craft, pizza making and opportunities for parents and carers chat to other families in a relaxed environment; the chance to try something new together that might otherwise be unaffordable such as the Maze, the Chairlift, the Farm. Parents and carers often tell us that the break gives them a chance to reset and helps them to better connect with their children, improving their capacity to manage the challenging times.

A big shout out to the volunteers who supported our Working Bee – Noni, Emily, Joan, Camille, Kane, Michelle, Raoul, Megan, Jack, Lucy, Simon, Miff, Brian, Louis, Stewart, Phil, Marie, Peter, Charles, Keeley, & Sharon. It's incredible what can be achieved in a few hours with 21 enthusiastic people. We were delighted that a wide variety of people decided to join us including some local community members who walked past and saw the working bee sign, as well as longstanding supporters of Saltbush. Saltbush relies heavily on our volunteers; this working bee contributed almost \$3000 value to our site! Last financial year, volunteers contributed over \$77,000 in value, much of it hands-on work improving the garden and houses.

Children watched, and even got to participate a little in the creation of a mural featuring sea creatures by Red Hill based artist, Michael Leeworthy, who generously donated his time and expertise. The children and their parents and carers had a wonderful time together, connecting and enjoying the large property and the delight of seeing the blue tongue lizards, koalas and of course, rabbits!

Saltbush has benefited from the beautiful and thoughtful works created by artists in residence, Kristin and Jennifer, who brought a warmth and generosity to their stay at Saltbush. We are enjoying their beautiful art, inspired by the nature around them, in the office and will display it more widely soon.

This winter, we've had some large and costly maintenance tasks to address including significant roof repairs, new blinds, the painting of the Nanospace Recreation Centre, house painting, and the repair of a retaining wall. We are very grateful to organisations, school groups and volunteers who supported us with these essential repairs. This not only helps us to provide our service today but prevents further maintenance issues in the future.
